

The Ashton Gardens Open for the 2022 Season

Guests are invited to rejuvenate in nature at Thanksgiving Point's 50-acre garden

LEHI, Utah (March 22, 2022) – Ashton Gardens, the 50-acre stately garden at Thanksgiving Point, opens for the spring season this Saturday, March 26. The Ashton Gardens will remain open until October 15, 2022, and will host multiple events and experiences throughout the spring, summer, and early fall.

The spring flowers are already starting to bloom at the Ashton Gardens. Guests who attend the opening weekend at the Gardens will see Crocus, Winter Aconite, miniature Iris, and other small bulbs in bloom. Guests will also see the stems of some tulips starting to grow in preparation for the Tulip Festival, starting April 8 and continuing through May 7. The first tulip that buds will be the "Showstopper," which will start blooming during the first week in April.

The Gardens are home to amazing wildlife as well. Birdwatchers can expect a terrific time, seeing many songbirds and migratory birds traveling into the Gardens for their seasonal visit. Pelicans, blue herons, geese, and ducks (to name a few) are taking up residence, some laying eggs. Guests who attend in the morning hours may even see a bunny or two bounding across the paths.

The Ashton Gardens are open Monday through Saturday from 9 am to 8 pm and are located at 3900 N. Garden Drive in Lehi, Utah. The gardens are organized like rooms, with trees, shrubs, and grasses serving as living barriers between the 17 themed spaces. Featuring grand lawns, beautiful seasonal plants, and the largest manmade waterfall in America, this space offers guests the opportunity to reflect and rejuvenate in the wonders of the natural world.
